We need certainty and clarity

As some of our major companies said recently, we need certainty and clarity about the way forward sooner rather than later and urge the British Government to settle with the EU as we still don't know what a post Brexit Britain will look like, two years after the Referendum. There is some reluctance from German business to invest in the UK with projects on hold because of the uncertainty about the future and with only nine months left before the UK leaves the EU, time is running out.

German business would like continued free access without tariff and non-tariff barriers for our exports to the UK and continued free access without tariff and non-tariff barriers to the EU for our exports from the UK, one of Germany's most important markets worldwide.

The British Government have articulated their wish to leave both the Single Market and the Customs Union and would like a comprehensive Free Trade Agreement with the EU after that, which may include a completely new Customs Agreement.

A Customs Agreement between the UK and the EU after Brexit would be in the interest of German business operating in the UK with minimum customs declarations and quota restrictions.

Dr Bernd Atenstaedt, Chairman and Chief Executive of GIUK said "We look forward to the White Paper on Britain's future trading relationship with Europe to be published next week. Hopefully this will finally give us the certainty and clarity we need."
